**Duncan and Marjorie Phillips and America's First Museum of Modern Art** Pamela Carter-Birken, 2021-07-06 He was born to privilege and sought the world of art She lived at the center of that world a working artist encouraged by the famous artists in her extended family Together Duncan Phillips and Marjorie Acker Phillips founded The Phillips Collection in Washington D C the first museum of modern art in America It opened in the grand Phillips family home in 1921 eight years before New York City's Museum of Modern Art and only a few weeks after they wed Duncan took the lead in developing the collection and showcasing it Marjorie kept space and time to paint Duncan considered Marjorie a partner in the museum even though she was not directly involved in all purchasing and presentation decisions To him her influence was omnipresent Although Duncan's writings on artists and art history were widely published he chose not to provide much instruction for visitors to the museum Instead he combined signature methods of displaying art which live on at The Phillips Collection Phillips had viewers in mind when he hung American art with European art or art of the past with modern art and he frequently rearranged works to stimulate fresh encounters With unfettered access to archival material author Pamela Carter Birken argues that The Phillips Collection's relevancy comes from Duncan Phillips's commitment to providing optimal conditions for personal exploration of art In depth collecting of certain artists was one of Phillips's methods of encouraging independent thinking in viewers Paintings by Pierre Bonnard Arthur Dove Georgia O Keeffe John Marin Jacob Lawrence and Mark Rothko provide testament to the power of America's first museum of modern art The Phillips Collection Phillips Collection, 1952 **John Marin** William Carlos Williams, Duncan Phillips, Dorothy Norman, 2023-12-22 **Collecting as Modernist Practice** Jeremy Braddock, 2012-01-18 In this highly original study Jeremy Braddock focuses on collective forms of modernist expression the art collection the anthology and the archive and their importance in the development of institutional and artistic culture in the United States Using extensive archival research Braddock's study synthetically examines the overlooked practices of major American art collectors and literary editors Albert Barnes Alain Locke Duncan Phillips Alfred Kreymborg Amy Lowell Ezra Pound Katherine Dreier and Carl Van Vechten He reveals the way collections were devised as both models for modernism's future institutionalization and culturally productive objects and aesthetic forms in themselves Rather than anchoring his study in the familiar figures of the individual poet artist and work Braddock gives us an entirely new account of how modernism was made one centered on the figure of the collector and the practice of collecting Collecting as Modernist Practice demonstrates that modernism's cultural identity was secured not so much through the selection of a canon of significant works as by the development of new practices that shaped the social meaning of art Braddock has us revisit the contested terrain of modernist culture prior to the dominance of institutions such as the Museum of Modern Art and the university curriculum so that we might consider modernisms that could have been Offering the most systematic review to date of the Barnes Foundation an intellectual genealogy and analysis of The New Negro

**Folk Treasures of Mexico** Marion Oettinger, Jr., 2010-03-31 In his foreword former New York governor and vice president of the United States Nelson A Rockefeller remembers his first trip to Mexico in 1933 and his subsequent life long fascination with the Mexican people and their popular art Rockefeller's collection of more than 3 000 pieces of Mexican folk art is widely considered to be the most exceptional in the U S and *Folk Treasures of Mexico* celebrates these icons created from the eighteenth to the twentieth centuries with more than 150 photos of the pieces many of which are quite rare This updated edition of the long out of print book focusing on this stunning collection of Mexican folk art contains a new foreword by Rockefeller's daughter Ann Rockefeller Roberts and a new prologue by Marion Oettinger Jr the director of the San Antonio Museum of Art who wrote the principal text about the collection Oettinger describes the objects according to function utilitarian ceremonial decorative or for play Among the many noteworthy objects are a wooden carved centurion helmet mask from the eighteenth century depicting a Roman guard which is one of the few remaining masks of this type in existence and a nineteenth century ceramic pitcher from Oaxaca that combines many stylistic techniques Other objects include a variety of children's toys clothing and items for eating and drinking First published in 1990 the book also contains the original preface by Rockefeller's daughter who was instrumental in finding permanent homes for her father's collection which can now be found in the San Antonio Museum of Art and the Mexican Museum in San Francisco Including a glossary bibliography and chronology *Folk Treasures of Mexico* is a must read for anyone interested in Latin American art culture and history
