A multidisciplinary intergenerational critical creative history of Mujeres de Maiz, a Los Angeles based Indigenous Xicana led spiritual activist organization and movement by and for women and feminists of color. In this text Tara Ward addresses this question to show that Instagram is best understood as a structure of the visual which includes not just the process of looking but what can be seen and by whom. Tracing the platform's own mythology for how it will be integrated into users' lives, [Appreciation Post](#) highlights the ways the constraints imposed by the experience of viewing limit the kinds of selves that can be presented on it, showing how the proliferation of technical knowledge especially amongst younger women has produced a revitalization of the myth of the masculine genius and a corresponding reinvigoration of masculine audience for art. Ward prompts contemplation of the meaning of various aspects of Instagram and the deliberate choices on the part of actual Instagrammers exploring what it is like to scroll through images on a phone, the skill involved in taking an Instagram worthy picture and the desires created by following influencers. This approach reveals how Instagram is shifting long established ways of interacting with images and makes an argument for art history's value as a way of understanding the contemporary world and the visual nature of identity today.

Unnamable Susette Min, 2018-06-05. Redraws the contours of Asian American art attempting to free it from a categorization that stifles more than it reveals. Charting its historical conditions and the expansive contexts of its emergence, Susette Min challenges the notion of Asian American art as a site of reconciliation for marginalized artists to enter into the canon or mainstream art scene. Pressing critically on the politics of visibility and recognition and how this categorization reduces artworks by Asian American artists within narrow parameters of interpretation, *Unnamable*

reconceives Asian American art not as a subset of objects but as a discursive medium that sets up the conditions for a politics to occur. By approaching Asian American art in this way, Min refigures the way we see Asian American art as an oppositional practice less in terms of its aspirations to be seen, its greater visibility and more in terms of how it models a different way of seeing and encountering the world. Uniquely presented, the chapters are organized thematically as mini exhibitions and offer readings of select works by contemporary artists including Tehching Hsieh, Byron Kim, Simon Leung, Mary Lum, and Nikki S. Lee. Inspired above all by their art practice, Min argues for an alternative approach to exhibition making and methods of reading that conceives of these works not as exemplary instances of Asian American art but as engaged in an aesthetic practice that remains open-ended, challenging the assumptions that racialize artists within an Asian American context. Ultimately, Unnamable insists that in order to reassess Asian American art and beyond its place in art history, we may need to let go not only of established viewing and curatorial practices but potentially even the category of Asian American art itself as we know it.

Malcolm Miles, 2007-04-26 *Cities and Cultures* is a critical account of the relations between contemporary cities and the cultures they produce and which in turn shape them. The book questions received ideas of what constitutes a city's culture through case studies in which different kinds of culture, the arts, cultural institutions and heritage, distinctive ways of life are seen to be differently used in or affected by the development of particular cities. The book does not mask the complexity of this but explains it in ways accessible for undergraduates. The book begins with introductory chapters on the concepts of a city and a culture, the latter in the anthropological sense as well as denoting the arts, citing cases from modern literature. The book then moves from a critical account of cultural production in a metropolitan setting to the idea that a city too is produced through the characteristic ways of life of its inhabitants. The cultural industries are scrutinised for their relation to such cultures as well as to city marketing and attention is given to the European Cities of Culture initiative and to the hybridity of contemporary urban cultures in a period of globalisation and migration. In its penultimate chapter the book looks at incidental cultural forms and cultural means to identify formation and in its final chapter examines the permeability of urban cultures and cultural forms. Sources are introduced, positions clarified and contrasted and notes given for selective further reading. Playing on the two meanings of culture, Miles takes a unique approach by relating arguments around these meanings to specific cases of urban development today. The book includes both critical comment on a range of literatures, being a truly interdisciplinary study and the outcome of the author's field research into urban cultures. *The One and the Many* Grant H.
