women administrators who empowered by their appointment as managers challenged the deeply embedded paternalism of their senior academic colleagues And it tells the stories of numerous heads of department and sections repositioned as managers in the new marketized further education who have struggled to re imagine students as funding units and colleagues as their staff Craig Prichard provides a highly nuanced theoretically sophisticated and critically informed account of the repositioning of senior university and college academics as managers This is important reading for those interested in post compulsory education public sector management and the sociology of work and education and of course for university and college managers themselves
