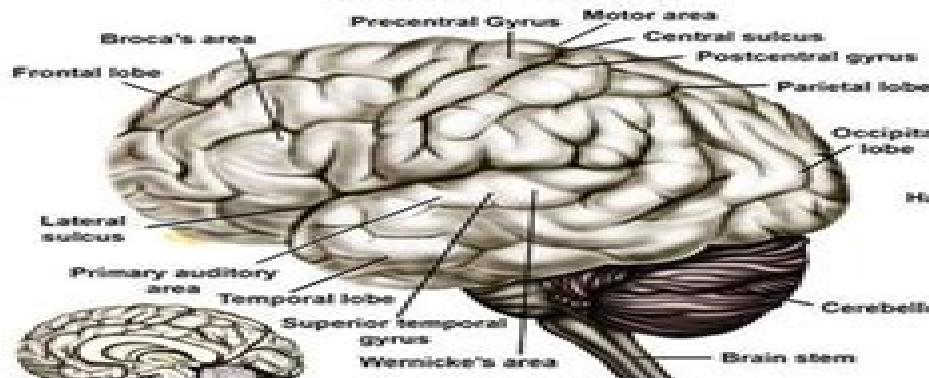
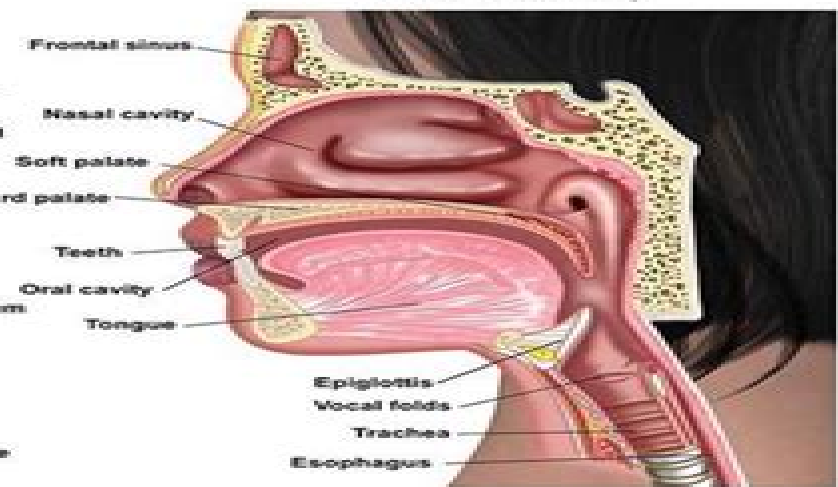

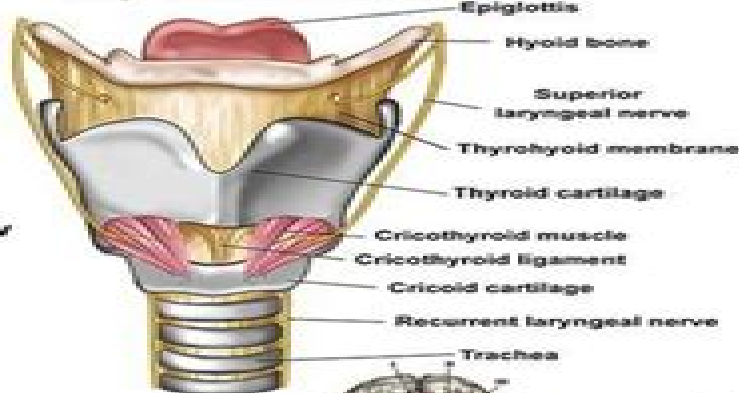
Brain Lateral View



Head cutaway



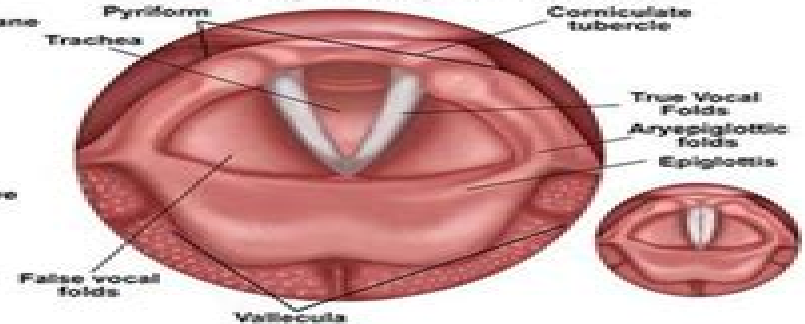
Larynx Anterior View



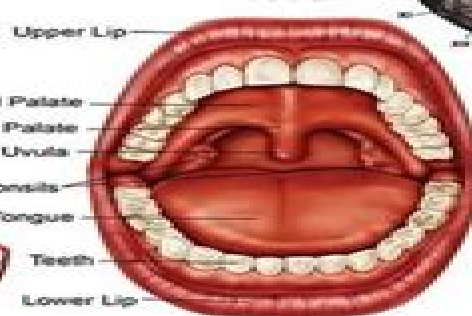
Posterior View
