Chapter ending lists of web resources add to the book's usefulness. **The Shaman and the Heresiarch** Gopal Sukhu, 2012-08-08. The Li sao also known as Encountering Sorrow attributed to the poet statesman Qu Yuan 4th-3rd century BCE is one of the cornerstones of the Chinese poetic tradition. It has long been studied as China's first extended allegory in poetic form yet most scholars agree that there is very little in the two thousand year old tradition of commentary on it that convincingly explains its supernatural flights, its complex floral imagery or the gender ambiguity of its primary poetic persona. *The Shaman and the Heresiarch* is the first book length study of the Li sao in English offering new translations of both the Li sao and the Nine Songs. The book traces the shortcomings of the earliest extant commentary on those texts that of Wang Yi back to the quasi divinatory methods of the highly politicized tradition of Chinese classical hermeneutics in general and the political machinations of a Han dynasty empress dowager in particular. It also offers an entirely new interpretation of the Li sao one based not on Qu Yuan hagiography but on what late Warring States period artifacts and texts including recently unearthed texts teach us about the cultural context that produced the poem. In that light we see in the Li sao not only a reflection of the era of the great classical Chinese philosophers but also the breakdown of the political religious order of the ancient state of Chu. *A Comparative History of World Philosophy* Ben-Ami Scharfstein, 1998-01-01. Breaks through the cultural barriers between Western Indian and Chinese philosophy and demonstrates that despite considerable differences between these three great philosophical traditions there are fundamental resemblances in their abstract principles. *Nietzsche, Heidegger, and Daoist Thought* Katrin Froese, 2012-02-01. In this book Katrin Froese juxtaposes the Daoist texts of Laozi and Zhuangzi with the thought of Nietzsche and Heidegger to argue that there is a need for rethinking the idea of a cosmological whole. By moving away from the quest for certainty Froese suggests a way of philosophizing that does not seek to capture the whole but rather becomes a means of affirming a connection to it one that celebrates difference rather than eradicating it. Human beings have a vague awareness of the infinite but they are nevertheless finite beings. Froese maintains that rather than bemoaning the murkiness of knowledge the thinkers considered here celebrate the creativity and tendency to wander through that space of not knowing or in between-ness. However for Nietzsche and the early Heidegger this in-between-ness can often produce a sense of meaninglessness that sends individuals on a frenetic quest to mark out space that is uniquely their own. Laozi and Zhuangzi on the other hand paint a portrait of the self that provides openings for others rather than deliberately forging an identity that it can claim as its own. In this way human beings can become joyful wanderers that revel in the movements of the Dao and are comfortable with their own finitude. Froese also suggests that Nietzsche and Heidegger are philosophers at a crossroads for they both exemplify the modern emphasis on self creation and at the same time share the Daoist insight into the perils of excessive

egoism that can lead to misguided attempts to master the world **Guodian** Kenneth Holloway, 2009-01-28 Fourteen years ago a corpus of bamboo strip texts was found in a late fourth century BCE tomb at Jingmen Hubei province in central China The discovery of the Guodian texts together with other recently discovered Warring States manuscripts has revolutionized the study of early Chinese intellectual history Kenneth Holloway argues that the Guodian corpus puts forth a political philosophy based on the harmonious interconnection of individuals engaged in moral self cultivation This unique worldview says Holloway cannot meaningfully be categorized as Confucian or Daoist because it shares important concepts and vocabulary with a number of different textual traditions that have anachronistically been characterized as competing or incompatible schools of thought He finds that within the Guodian corpus familiar philosophical concepts and texts are applied in distinctive ways presenting a worldview that is quite different from the received textual traditions In addition to contributing to our understanding of this particular body of texts Holloway proposes a methodology for assessing a corpus of texts without relying on assumptions and definitions that derive from two millennia of scholarship From Deluge to Discourse Deborah Lynn Porter, 1996-01-01 Proposes a sweeping theory of flood myths applies it to a particular text the Mu T ien tzu chuan and opens up the world of Chinese fiction to an entirely new type of analysis based on a psychoanalytic theory of the symbol Spirit and Self in Medieval China Nanxiu Qian, 2001-06-01 The Shih shuo hsin yu conventionally translated as A New Account of Tales of the World is one of the most significant works in the entire Chinese literary tradition It established a genre the Shih shuo t i and inspired dozens of imitations from the later part of the Tang dynasty 618 907 to the early Republican era of the twentieth century The Shih shuo hsin yu consists of more than a thousand historical anecdotes about elite life in the late Han dynasty and the Wei Chin period about A D 150 420 Despite a general recognition of the place of the Shih shuo hsin yu in China s literary history and to a lesser extent that of Japan the genre itself has never been adequately defined or thoroughly studied Spirit and Self in Medieval China offers the first thorough study in any language of the origins and evolution of the Shih shuo t i based on a comprehensive literary analysis of the Shih shuo hsin yu and a systematic documentation and examination of more than thirty imitations The study also contributes to the growing interest in the Chinese idea of individual identity By focusing on the Shin shuo genre which provides the starting point in China for a systematic literary construction of the self it demonstrates that contrary to Western assertions of a timeless Chinese tradition an authentic understanding of personhood in China changed continually and often significantly in response to changing historical and cultural circumstances **Religion in Human Evolution** Robert N.
